FLYING START FOR JONES

Young Newmarket-based trainer Jack Jones has been making a name for himself recently, having trained seven winners on the Flat since taking out his licence just over a year ago and saddling his first winner over hurdles last week from just a small group of horses, writes Alex Scott.

"I started with three horses and things have slotted into place nicely", said Jones. "We're looking for angles to get more clients and more horses, but I'm keeping my head down and kicking on."

The 28-year-old, who has already worked for an array of trainers across the globe, including David Simcock, Richard Spencer, Ger Lyons, Mikel Delzangles and Chris Waller, trained his first winner in November when new recruit **Chagall (Slade Power)** won a handicap at Chelmsford, "We picked him up from Ireland and he won on his first start for us. He was rated 46 when he first came to us and progressed to 60, winning twice and finishing second four times. He's a handy horse and he's been a star for us. The first winner is one you'll never forget!"

A handy bit of placing also saw the seven-year-old gelding pick up some decent prize money as Jones explains: "He finished second at Bath on Good Friday and that was frustrating, but he won over £6,000, more than he would have won for winning another race anywhere else that week."

Other successful handicappers in the yard include the five-year-old **Navy Drums** (**Super Saver**), who has won twice already this year. "We got him from the Tattersalls Online [November] Sale and paid 4,200gns for him from Robert Cowell and he has won well over £10,000 and finished second twice."

Jones' success with other people's cast-offs doesn't stop there either, having also trained the filly **Shot** (**Acclamation**) to win on her stable debut. Meanwhile, his two-year-olds include the promising colt **Up The Manor** (**Soldier's Call**) and the filly **Fengari** (**Territories**), both of whom won on debut this May.

"Fengari won at Leicester and was a £5,000 vendor yearling [Goffs UK]. She's a nice filly, not overly big, but her work had been good before her run. She'll go somewhere with a penalty within the next ten days or so. Ben [Curtis] said she should improve heaps for the experience.

"Up The Manor is probably the most exciting going forward, he won at Doncaster and had only been with me a month after coming from the Breeze-Up sale. He's a small, sharp, ready sort and went straight back into exercise. His two bits of work before Doncaster were good and he showed plenty. He did it well and learnt on the job and although we're finalising plans, we could potentially go to the [Listed] Windsor Castle Stakes at Royal Ascot. I think he is a genuinely nice horse and if he can improve a bit between now and then, he should be bang there, hopefully."

Jones, who is a former point-to-point rider, hails from a jumping background and has put that experience to good use, having trained **Our Scholar** (**Exceed And Excel**) to win a maiden hurdle at Warwick last week.

"We bought him on spec from the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale last year. From having a two-year-old winner first time out to a maiden hurdle winner is satisfying. My grandmother trained jumpers in Worcestershire and my mother worked for David Nicholson. I'd love to train 80 per cent Flat horses to 20 per cent jumpers, but everything is clicking into place. We have 14 horses in and four two-year-olds in right now, but, as great as the winners are, there's always hunger for more."

PRIX DU JOCKEY CLUB SET FOR SMALLEST FIELD SINCE 2003

A total of 12 colts remained engaged in Sunday's Gr.1 Prix du Jockey Club following yesterday's supplementary entry stage which saw just **Feed The Flame** (**Kingman**) added to the list of potential competitors.

Aidan O'Brien has said that one of his two candidates **Adelaide River** (**Australia**) is likely to run in the Gr.1 Derby at Epsom on Saturday instead, meaning that **Continuous** (**Heart's Cry**) will be his only representative in the Chantilly Classic, hence the final line-up will feature no more than 11 runners.

So the 2023 field will be the smallest since **Dalakhani** beat just six rivals in 2003. That was the penultimate time that the Jockey Club was run over 2400m before it was reduced in distance to its current 2100m in 2005, partly in an attempt to attract more runners after it had been blighted with a single-figure field twice in the previous six years.

The final declaration stage for this year's Qatar-sponsored Jockey Club is at 9.30am this morning. **Feed The Flame** is set to be ridden by Christophe Soumillon, who has jumped ship from **American Flag (Wootton Bassett)**, whom he partnered when he was favourite for last month's Gr.1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains but

severely compromised his chance with a very slow start prior to finishing fourth. Stephane Pasquier will deputise aboard **American Flag**.

Unraced until April but unbeaten in two starts, **Feed The Flame** is trained by the 70-year-old Pascal Bary, who is considered a Jockey Club specialist, having won it six times, but has not won any race at Gr.1 level since **Study Of Man** lifted the Jockey Club five years ago.

The other leading contenders are the Poulains hero **Marhaba Ya Sanafi** (**Muhaarar**) and the runaway Gr.3 Prix de Guiche victor **Big Rock** (**Rock Of Gibraltar**). John and Thady Gosden's **Epictetus** (**Kingman**) is set to be the only British runner.

A CROWNING WEEK FOR HAYES

As **Bobby Dassler** crossed the line in front in the penultimate race of Tuesday's evening meeting at Nottingham, it was crowning a memorable week for Limerick jockey Chris Hayes.

Just over 24 hours after guiding **Tahiyra** (**Siyouni**) to Gr.1 Irish 1,000 Guineas success in the famous Aga Khan colours, Hayes could celebrate for another reason, as his old ally **Awtaad** sired his first Gr.1 winner when **Anmaat** arrived late in the day to land the Prix d'Ispahan in the equally famous Shadwell silks.

Awtaad, who was trained by Kevin Prendergast and donned the same silks of the late Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum, was ridden by Hayes in all nine of his career starts. He won the Madrid Handicap and Listed Tetrarch Stakes en-route to winning the Gr.1 Irish 2,000 Guineas, an identical path followed by this year's Irish Guineas victor **Paddington** (**Siyouni**).

"For **Awtaad**, it was a long time coming," said Hayes. "He's a good sire of tough, quality racehorses. His stock tend to need a bit of time, which at this moment in time probably isn't that fashionable, so he has to go and do it the hard way. Siring a Gr.1 winner was very important for him.

"It was great to see Ringfort Stud as the winning breeders, as Derek and Gay [Veitch] have proven time and time again what good breeders they are. They dissect pedigrees and aren't afraid to go down the non-conventional route. They breed to suit the mare, rather than the market, and their results speak for themselves."

For those thinking of the Veitch's success stories, think Gr.1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner and sire **Minzaal** (**Mehmas**), the dual Gr.2-winning sire **Threat** (**Footstepsinthesand**), Gr.2 Lowther Stakes winner and twice Gr.1-placed **Miss Amulet** (**Sir Prancealot**) and Gr.2 Flying Childers Stakes winner and sire **Ubettabelieveit** (**Kodiac**), amongst many others.



Since Hayes, along with his now wife Rachel, started their own breeding programme with just two mares, he acknowledges the help that the Veitch's have been to him. Not only for consigning their stock, but for general breeding chat: "They're always on hand with advice and just a chat about the game. Breeding is something that fascinates me and once you start looking at a pedigree, you can really go down a rabbit hole of different families, sires, and intricacies, so they've always been there to listen to me.

"I've found it has definitely helped my day job, as I'm constantly seeing different traits in families and sires, from ground preferences, to attitude. Adding it all into the mix of what you've ridden or been told about the horse, it all helps in your preparation."

On Tuesday, with sights slightly lowered to the 0-70 extended 1m handicap at Nottingham, Hayes was again in jubilant mood thanks to **Bobby Dassler**'s success, as not only is he also from the Classic-winning son of **Cape Cross**'s second crop, but in the official form book, the winning breeder reads, for the first time, as Chris Hayes Racing Limited. He is the first foal out of the **Oasis Dream** mare **Butoolat**, who was purchased at the Tattersalls July Sale. Hayes recalls the story: "I had ridden **Butoolat** plenty at home and on the track and she had a lot of ability. It just never happened for her on the track for one reason or another, even though she was placed on numerous occasions. She went to the sales and as it happened, I was looking for a mare to send to **Awtaad** to support him. I was lucky enough to get her bought for 10,000gns through Aidan O'Ryan, but had to fend off stiff opposition from Mr Prendergast, who sent the same agent to the same sale to buy her.

"Aidan told us 'You may sort it out between you', but to be fair to the boss, he let me have her in the end. That was the beginning of the good luck."

Sent to **Awtaad**, her resulting foal was **Bobby Dassler**, who was sold to Tally-Ho Stud for €65,000 at the Goffs November Foal Sale when consigned by Ringfort Stud. Updates followed, firstly through **Nazeef** (**Invincible Spirit**), who won both the Gr.1 Falmouth Stakes and Gr.1 Sun Chariot Stakes, and then through **Mostahdaf** (**Frankel**), who has won four Gr.3s to date for John and Thady Gosden. Indeed, her three-year-old half-brother **Mostabshir** (**Dark Angel**) was a five-length winner in good style at York on his most recent start and, holding an official rating of 108, he is as short as 8/1 for the Gr.1 St James's Palace Stakes.

"It was important for **Bobby Dassler** to go and do it, because you can have all the updates you want, but if the mare doesn't get off the mark with a winner early, it makes it harder to sell the resulting produce.

"Butoolat has a yearling colt by Kodiac, which we sold for €42,000 at the Goffs November Foal Sale. We didn't cover her last year and she is currently in foal to Cotai Glory from a good, early cover."

Hayes quickly puts an end to any talk of upscaling: "No way. We've two mares and for now, that's enough. My wife Rachel works full-time and I am obviously very busy race-riding, so it's absolutely enough for now. We'll enjoy this one for now, but fingers crossed **Bobby Dassler** is the first of many."



GOLD COAST YEARLING SALE - DAY 2

There was to be no correction to the downward slide that started on Tuesday at yesterday's second and final session of the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale, *writes Glen Latham*. A lack of enthusiasm from the domestic buying bench generally left the

better lots to buyers from Asia and, while they were strong on selected youngsters, they were never going to buy at the levels necessary for the metrics to keep pace with 2022.

For the second day running, a filly topped proceedings, with Sally Williams of Tony Fung Investments giving A\$450,000 for **Lot 1643**, a daughter of **Zoustar** and the **More Than Ready** mare **Palazzo Cristallo**, from the draft of Gerry Harvey's Baramul Stud. Good money though nearly half a million is, she finished well short of the A\$750,000 Denys Chan gave for a **The Autumn Sun** filly on Tuesday.

As co-proprietor of Magic Millions, Harvey often keeps some nice types back to support this sale and he will have been happy with the competition this lass attracted, while **Zoustar**'s reputation continues to grow, his fillies especially sought after. The fourth foal out of **Palazzo Cristallo** who was placed once in a country maiden, the filly is a half-sister to the winners **Selhurst Park (Not A Single Doubt)** and **Pyromania (Snitzel)**. There was plenty of quality on the page, as her dam is out of **Palacio De Cristal**, a dual Gr.2 winner and Gr.1-placed daughter of **Encosta De Lago**, while she in turn is out of **Crystal Palace**, a **Palace**



Music full-sister to the three-time Gr.1 winner **Naturalism**. A star of his generation, **Naturalism** was Gr.1-placed a further eight times, including a second when taken to Tokyo for the Japan Cup. Yesterday's filly carries a desirable double cross of **Encosta De Lago** as the sire of **Palacio De Cristal** and grandsire of **Zoustar**.

Speaking after signing for the filly on behalf of her boss, Williams told the press: "I'm really excited. She's a beautiful filly, so athletic with loads of quality. She has an air of elegance about her and looks really fast. You will have noticed that we have bought a few lovely fillies this year, as the Fung family really enjoy racing fillies and they hold their value. We can always go on and breed with them after they finish racing."

The dearest colt and second top priced lot of the session is Hong Kong bound, after trainer Manfred Man gave A\$240,000 for a son of the young sire **Hellbent** (**I Am Invincible**) and the fourtime winner **Silent Rage**. A daughter of **Nicconi**, **Silent Rage** was at her best up to 1400m, while her full-sister **Hear The Chant** won the Gr.3 Thoroughbred Club Stakes over 1200m. The colt was offered by Scone farm Kitchwin Hills.

While the **Hellbent** colt will eventually head northwest, a son of the ever reliable sire **All Too Hard** will head east and remain below the equator, having been bought for A\$155,000, the third top price of the session. The youthful combination of New Zealand trainer Steven Cole and expat Kiwi bloodstock agent Bevan Smith teamed up to buy the colt, **Lot 1685**. Like the top seller, he came from the Baramul draft and is out of a **More Than Ready** mare, this time the twice-placed **Sawn Off Shotgun**.

Of all the yearling sales on the calendar, the National Sale looked particularly vulnerable to the pressure being exerted by the economy in general. For the local market, traditionally this sale has offered a final chance for trainers to fill the odd box by buying something inexpensive and selling it down in shares. In the COVID era, finding owners to pick up those shares was easy, not so with the global economy as it is, no matter how much prize money is on offer down here. In short, coming at the very end of the yearling sales season, the National Sale relies heavily on there still being unspent cash in the marketplace, and for the past two years it just hasn't been lying around.

In the wash-up over the two days 207 lots sold, down from the 264 at last year's 16 per cent thicker catalogue. Gross sales were

down from A\$14m to A\$9.4m, with the average falling 14.25 per cent to A\$45,510. The clearance rate of 68 per cent is down four points on last year, while the most positive indicator came from the median, which held steady at A\$30,000.

Once the yearlings had departed, the 20-lot National Racehorse Sale was conducted with two lots sharing top billing at A\$130,000 each.

Both were sold as part of the Tony Fung Investments reduction, with the **Lonhro** gelding **Fearless Knight** (**Lot 1907**) the first to go through. Bought by Wai Yin Li and James Moore, who mixes his bloodstock work in the Asian market with his training yard at Caloundra north of Brisbane, **Fearless Knight** is a maiden winner that was good enough to run fourth in the Gr.3 Norman Robinson Stakes, a major lead-up to the Gr.1 Victoria Derby. The other top seller was the two-year-old **Lope De Vega** colt **Rimbaud** (**Lot 1915**), which will remain in the Annabel Neasham stable after the Warwick Farm trainer saw off the opposition. Although yet to win, he has shown enough to suggest he will recoup his purchase price without too much bother.

Ever the realist, Magic Millions Managing Director Barry Bowditch was still happy with the results achieved across the National Sales series of first weanlings, then broodmares, yearlings and finally racehorses, spread over three weeks: "To sell 207 horses for an average price of over A\$45,000 and gross almost A\$10m is a pleasing result at the end of a year when a lot of yearlings have been traded. We did only clear 68 per cent (this week) but, in saying that, this is a sale that doesn't clear so well generally and it is probably a result that is close to being in line with our expectations." Discussing the National series as a whole, Bowditch was happy, explaining: "I would say the National Sale has been a great success, given the fact we've sold A\$141m worth of horses and sold them to many different countries and jurisdictions, and facilitated the sale of a huge amount of horses for our vendors. Obviously, the market's become a little bit more selective and a bit more cautious, but in saying that, A\$141m is still a big result in the scheme of things."

So with the yearlings done for the year, there remains just next week's Inglis Great Southern Sale of weanlings and broodmares to round out this season. Then through October and November we have the Breeze-Up Sales on both sides of the Tasman, before returning to the Gold Coast for Magic Millions' flagship yearling sale in January.

Scrubbed along towards the rear as the leaders went a ferocious gallop up front, **Ganesha** (**Showcasing**) came through to lead at the furlong pole and went on to make a winning debut.

He is the second foal out of the dual Italian Gr.3 winner My Lea (Dandy Man), a full-sister to the Listed winner Royal Lea and the Listed-placed juvenile winner Royal Mylea. Their dam Luvmedo ran twice as a juvenile and produced eight winners in all, including the Listed-placed Pivotal Rio (Captain Rio). The third dam Dress Code (Barathea) produced the Listed-placed winner Dress To Impress (Fasliyev) and Lucky General (Hawk Wing), who earned €985,000 for his victory in the 2009 Goffs Million Sprint. Dress Code is also the grandam of the Listed Hyde Stakes winner and twice Gr.3-placed The Wizard Of Eye (Galileo Gold).

Bobby's Blessing was detached early, but the **Bobby's Kitten** colt stayed on strongly to win narrowly on debut.

He is a half-brother to the seven-time winner **Atalanta's Boy** (**Paco Boy**), who won seven times and held an official rating of 96. Their dam **Affirmatively** (**Diktat**) won as a juvenile and was beaten just four lengths in the Listed Aubigny Stakes. She is the only winner out of the winning **Lion Cavern** mare **Circlet**, who is a half-sister to two further winners. 2yo colt by **Wootton Bassett** ex **Zaridiya** (**Duke Of Marmalade**) Bred by **S A Aga Khan**

The Jean-Claude Rouget-trained **Zabiari** (**Wootton Bassett**) overcame inexperience and trouble in running to make an impressive winning debut over 1300m at Longchamp last week, quickening past the whole field in the final 250m to win with something to spare. The runner-up, fellow newcomer **Will Scarlet** (**Masar**), also deserves an honourable mention for his performance after fluffing the start.

Zabiari is the third winner from three runners out of the Listed-placed Duke Of Marmalade mare Zaridiya, and he promises to be her best offspring yet. Her first foal, Zariyannka (First Defence), was a €5,500 cast off at the Arqana February Mixed Sale, before winning in Czechia and Slovakia, while her second runner Zimaniya (Iffraaj) won twice in the French provinces. Zaridiya is a granddaughter of the Gr.3 winner Zarkiya (Catrail), a near relation of the great Zarkava (Zamindar) and descended from Petite Etoile (Petition). Given his lineage, there is ample scope for Zabiari to build on this promising debut success and go on to make his mark in higher company.
